Benefits of Compensation

Lung cancer and mesothelioma are recognized occupational diseases by the Workplace Safety and Insurance Board (WSIB).

If you file for a claim and the WSIB accepts the claim, your benefits could include:

- Health care and medical costs
- Loss of earnings payments
- Non-economic loss benefits compensation for physical, functional, or psychological loss
- Personal care allowance to hire attendants and an independent living allowance
- Home modifications to facilitate independent living

Benefits are also available to the families of workers who suffer from mesothelioma or lung cancer. These benefits can include:

- A lump sum payment and monthly payments to your spouse or children
- Educational support through post-secondary education for your children
- Counseling services for your spouse and children
- Burial expenses
- Employment assistance to your spouse to support return to work

If you were exposed to asbestos in your workplace, you can file a claim. Despite the benefits available, few workers with mesothelioma or lung cancer file for compensation.

Close to 90% of mesothelioma claims filed in Ontario are accepted and receive compensation. Those that do not receive compensation are generally workers who are not insured by the WSIB (for example, self-employed workers), those who were not exposed in the workplace, those who were not exposed in Ontario, and those who abandon their claim before receiving compensation.
